It has been 3 months since the UK election. The 56 SNP MPs shook Westminster with their verve, their tweets, their passion *and* their maiden speeches. The party, and Nicola Sturgeon, stayed true to their word. They have projected a unified and particularly Scottish voice never heard before in Westminster. There is no doubt that 'brand Scotland', complete with responsible social and cultural values has been exported and espoused as never before.

And there, unfortunately, the fairy tale ends.

The Unionist agenda, so ably abetted by consistent Labour party abstentions, has drowned out the SNP voice and further marginalised the poor, the disabled and ensured that Westminster's insidious attacks against the *hoi polloi* cannot be stopped.

Where do we Scots go from here?

On Aug 16th 1967 Dr. Martin Luther King said "In short, over the last ten years the Negro decided to straighten his back up (*Yes*), *realizing that a man cannot ride your back unless it is bent.* (*Yes*, *That's right*). We made our government write new laws to alter some of the cruellest injustices that affected us. "Wee White Blossom" indeed.

When will the "Flower of Scotland" bloom – if ever?

When will being called "Nazi" or a "vile Nationalist" when we ask for freedom be the last straw?

When will we straighten our spines and forever consign to history's annals Westminster's notion that *our civil and human right* to assert our sovereignty is not only inevitable, but a recognised United Nations basic Human right? To be *who we are* – *Scottish*.

Why do we wait?

Again, where do we Scots go from here?

From some there are calls for a second independence referendum. However, Nicola Sturgeon continues to stand by her public stance running up to May 7^{th,}, that she intends to "unify" the Scottish people and use the 56 SNP MPs to better the lives of *all* Scots.

It must be a hard fact to realize the Unionists in Scotland will never, ever support Independence. They will never, ever back improving the lot of their fellows. They are *forever* bound to the ideals of division and poverty *their* parties stand for.

It is not Westminster's nor Nicola Sturgeons place to tell the Scottish Nation a vote is how we have to state our claim to freedom. Who does that? Who does that! No one.

The Union will be dissolved when the Scottish people say it is dissolved, be it by a vote or a mass demonstrations in our city streets.

Will that dissolution and declaration of sovereignty come from Holyrood and the SNP, or, from a group of freedom loving individuals?

Will it be Nicola Sturgeon and a majority vote in Holyrood or Scottish intellectuals and business people. Will it be Scots cast from the same mould as peaceful freedom fighters like the Czech writer Václav Havel, or Dr. Martin Luther King, or like Lech Wałęsa of Solidarity in Poland, Mahatma Gandhi, or Nelson Mandela?

Who in the Scottish Independence movement will raise their voices and stand tall?

When will the Scots straighten their backs and stop their colonial masters in Westminster clinging there?

Mr. Cameron, you cannot stop the inevitable without the use of force and that you cannot do. The rUK would become a pariah state and your U.N. security council seat would be forfeit.

The Unionists who live in Scotland are welcome to stay. Since September 2014 the Scots have become more critically aware of social and cultural needs and we *are an inclusive and progressive people*. Every person who loves Scotland and chose to make their home in Scotland can stay and make it an even *better place to live* post Independence.

Independence will only further Scotland's fiscal, cultural and social wealth for the benefit of *all living within her borders*. If Unionism is more important to some than that, there is always the remainder-UK (rUK) for those who value submissive political need before real world freedoms and a healthy society.
